

It is their specific brand of humor, which means you either appreciate and get it or it is not for you. I did not read this book from start to finish. I have not read every entry, but every entry I have read made me laugh. I often re-read passages out loud to friends and family whenever I get the chance. The book is put together using high quality materials. The writing is top notch. And the book is funny. This is a table book, you will probably read bits and pieces, not the whole thing at once. Leaving it on the table can start some interesting/hilarious discussions. It's also quite Onion-y, so if you don't know what the Onion is, you might want to find out before ordering blind (just Google it). Overall, fantastic and should come in 2-packs.

In the Onion's typical style, many entries have enough of a basis in history and fact to be wildly entertaining, especially if you recognize where the riffs are originating from. A good example is setting Louisa May Alcott's "Little Women" in the Civil War, characterizing it as a

"...semiautobiographical account of the hundreds of grotesque battlefield amputations [Alcott] performed in the waning days of the conflict. The story follows Josephine "Jo" March Bhaer and two fellow nurses as they race to remove the badly crushed and gangrenous limbs of sobbing Union soldiers who have been rushed to field hospitals, many of them with blood still gushing in crimson torrents from their open wounds. Exhausted and covered in infected pus, flesh, and sinew, the three women bond over jamming spent munitions into soldiers' mouths before frantically sawing off their arms or legs without anesthesia, and then, years later, over trying to drown out the shrill cries of agony that continue to haunt their dreams. Alcott's classic novel is still beloved by women around the world and has been adapted into several stomach-turning, almost unwatchable feature-length films."The Onion at the top of its game.
