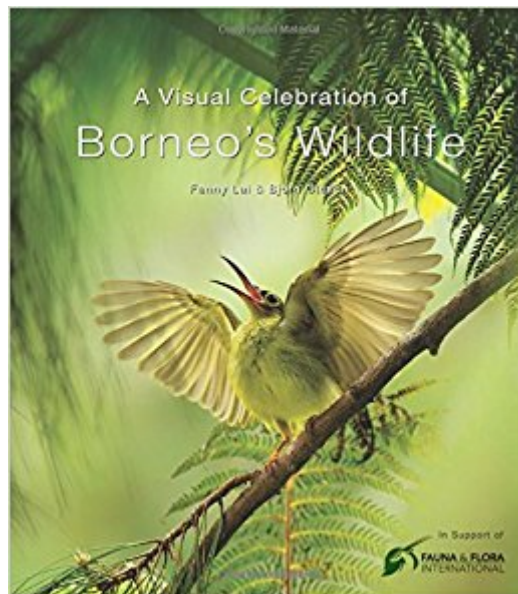




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A Visual Celebration Of Borneo's Wildlife: [All Royalties Donated To Fauna & Flora International]

Fanny Lai is passionate about wildlife. She is a cartoonist, author, travel writer and former Group CEO of Wildlife Reserves Singapore comprising of Singapore Zoo, Night Safari, Jurong Bird Park and River Safari. She is equally known for her entrepreneurial business development skills following a career that has spanned more than 30 years in branding marketing and corporate management. Bjorn Olesen is a retired corporate executive, award-winning wildlife photographer, author and engaged conservationist. A Singapore permanent resident, he lived for 16 years in Malaysia and Indonesia, so Borneo, which he has visited dozens of times, is literally his home turf. His images and articles have appeared in overseas and local publications. All of his photos are available free of charge to non-profit NGOs.

The book portrays an amazing collection of wildlife. In turning the pages, the pictures so vividly & beautifully photographed, it seemed like the animals and forests are right there with me in my living room. My favourite part of the book are the section on birds - utterly gorgeous and so colourful. IF

The photographs in this magnificent book are far more than just beautiful objects, or even (as the title says) a "celebration" of Borneo's wildlife. They are valuable scientific documents, accompanied by an illuminating text. Here you will find beautifully-printed images of some of Borneo's rarest and most endangered plants and animals, including the recently-rediscovered Bornean Rainbow Toad, the remarkable Bornean Earless Monitor (now being decimated by unscrupulous collectors), and the Spectacled Flowerpecker (a bird still undescribed by science). Some of these photographs, such as the superb camera-trap shot of a Bornean Bay Cat, are the only decent ones ever taken in the wild of the species they portray. Others illustrate behaviours only recently discovered, such as the mutualistic relationship between the Mountain Treeshrew and Low's Pitcherplant (as the mammal feeds on nectar, its droppings fall into the pitchers and provide the plant with nutrients). Others are simply amazing; as someone who knows how difficult it can be to photograph wildlife in Borneo, I am still in awe of the Bat Hawk snatching Wrinkle-lipped Bats out of the air and the pin-sharp Giant Pitta. Most of the photographs are the work of Bjorn Olesen, but the editor, Yong Ding Li, wisely decided to include the work of other photographers so that some extreme rarities could be included (such as the highly-localised Black Oriole, photographed by Yeo Siew Teck in the Paya Maga highlands of eastern Sarawak). Borneo enthusiasts have a wide range of superb natural history books available (mostly published by the indefatigable CL Chan's Natural History Publications (Borneo)), including many beautifully-illustrated monographs filled with specialized

information. This, though, is surely the best general single-volume book on Borneo's wildlife available. It is a necessary purchase for anyone awed by tropical nature, and will surely inspire those seeking to save some of the vanishing wildlife it portrays. I am very glad indeed to have it on my shelf.

From the stunning photograph on the cover and all the way through to the very last, this book is a remarkable accomplishment. Apart from being a visual delight, it is also an extremely informative and well-written book. It is divided into main sections dealing with The Land, Flora, Wildlife, The People, Conservation and Places to Go, and each main section is further divided into sub-chapters, which makes it possible for the reader at a glance to find and study a subject of particular interest. But the book deserves to be read and enjoyed from cover to cover, as it is a poignant reminder of the fragility of nature and the diverse creatures living therein, especially in the environment of a tropical rain forest. If we are not mindful of the destruction of the habitat, all the diversity will eventually be a thing of the past, and then future generations will only have photographs [such as those in this book] and other visual images to remind them of what once were. Fanny Lai and Bjorn Olesen should be congratulated for their magnificent work and the years of time and effort spent gathering material for their book in support of a very worthwhile cause, namely Fauna & Flora International. This book is highly recommended as a wake-up call for the general reader, as well as to any person concerned with the future of wildlife, not just on Borneo, but all over the world.
