Before Wizards of the Coast re-released the Magic Item Compendium, I had made a reasonable effort to buy this at a reasonable price, but was unsuccessful. I was delighted to finally be able to get my hands on a crisp new copy. It has a beautiful improvement to the cover. I would recommend this book to anyone who still plays D&D 3.5. It significantly improves the magic item options for low level characters. That being said, I was disappointed to find that despite the advertisement that it "includes errata," it does not. Many of the errors would have been very simple to fix--substituting price X with price y--but this rudimentary copy editing was not done. If you are buying this book for the errata, you should save your money.

Wizards of the Coast/Hasbro lied! The Premium Spell Compendium, Monster Manual, Players Handbook, and Dungeon Master Guide all include the promised errata but this product doesn't have it at all. All you are paying for with this is a fancy new hard cover. Buy a used one if you really want this book and don't already have a copy. Better yet, find a copy on the internet.

For anyone like myself who still plays 3.5 this book is very nice. Lots of low level/low cost magical

items you can give players 1-5 and the tools inside goes on and on. Really something to buy if your group or you the DM want to make your campaigns more exciting loot wise. I was kind of sad when I found that there was no errata but I didn't own a copy already so it didn't hurt me that badly. I like how the tables in the back list items by both slot and price which really helps arm npcs with every item possible. I wish it had a listing of EVERY material for 3.5, but again no errata. Definitely buy online as in the book store this puppy is still 50-60 bucks on the shelf.

This book came with the original Shrink-wrap of Wizards, from Bellwether Books! Quicker than estimated delivery and in ultimately satisfying condition. The book itself has a huge selection of content ready for play. It seems to offer visual detail of each item as I skim through it. For the DM and player alike, this book can allow for customization of gear that can either be found or sought for within any campaign.

A friend of mine told me there was no errata. I have had the book for only 2 weeks (pre-ordered it 3 months ago), so I took the 5 minutes to get a Win-Zip trial and look it up online. Sure enough, no errata. I contacted WotC right away (7/29/13) via phone and they didn't even /know/ there was a mistake. I double checked their website and it said right there it was supposed to have it. They took my email address and sent me a response. I got the final message today (7/31/13). "Thank you for contacting us. I have spoken with the Dungeons and Dragons team on this. It appears that the information that errata was included was in error. We do apologize for this confusion. We will be correcting the information on the website to reflect this. In this case if you wish to return this item, please feel free to contact the store you purchased it at as we are not able to issue a direct refund. If you have any questions or need further assistance please feel free to contact us." In my rebuke on the survey, I called them out on this cheap move. They have been advertising this for 6+ months at least to have the errata and they are just too cheap to re-print the books with it and replace/reimburse those of us who have already gotten this book under false advertising. I have the old Magic Item Compendium, now I have the same book with a different cover and they are telling me to go screw myself. Shame on them.

Never had the original, so as someone who doesn't have an "old" Compendium sitting around, this book was just what my group needed to have a large, expanded list of magic items and upgrade options not found in the 3 core books all in one spot. If you don't have an old Magic Item Compendium, it's well worth it!!
