

This 10 ½ x 10 ½ inch book is more than just another coffee table book. This book is organized into 10 chapters detailing the training, preparation and jump into Normandy by the 101st Airborne Division. Bando, through his unique relationship with over 900 World War II airborne

veterans spanning 30 years, has unearthed a treasure-trove of photographs (some in full color) never before seen by the public. He has liberated them from footlockers and shoeboxes left in attics all over America by the old veterans who never spoke of their service. Each chapter contains well-written commentary accompanied by first person accounts by the veterans. Their memories and recollections provide a stark realism to every chapter. Bando even dedicates one the chapters to the 82nd Airborne Division, showing while favoring the Screaming Eagles, he's not about to ignore the great contributions of the "other" American airborne division on D-Day. The book contains a glossary of terms and an abbreviated index. But it's the human connection that makes this a great book in its own right. It was an important research tool in writing my historical novel, *The Last Jump* and I'm sure it will enlighten and entertain any World War II buff who reads it.
