We'll meet his friends and foes, his family, his teammates, and bosses, and we'll discover what motivates him, and where his strengths and weaknesses lie. For the first time, here is the full story in Guy's own words. From the boy who learned to prep bikes with his dad, to the spirited team mechanic, paying his way by collecting beer glasses in pubs, to the young racer at the start of his first race and the buzz he's been chasing ever since. This thrilling autobiography is an intense and dramatic ride.

Guy Martin is a British motorcycle racer and mechanic, and in his spare time he presents TV programs. In 2011 he starred in the BAFTA nominated cult documentary film TT: Closer to the Edge. Guy has previously made documentary series with North One Television – one for the BBC, called The Boat that Guy Built, and How Britain Worked for Channel 4, and now Speed.
