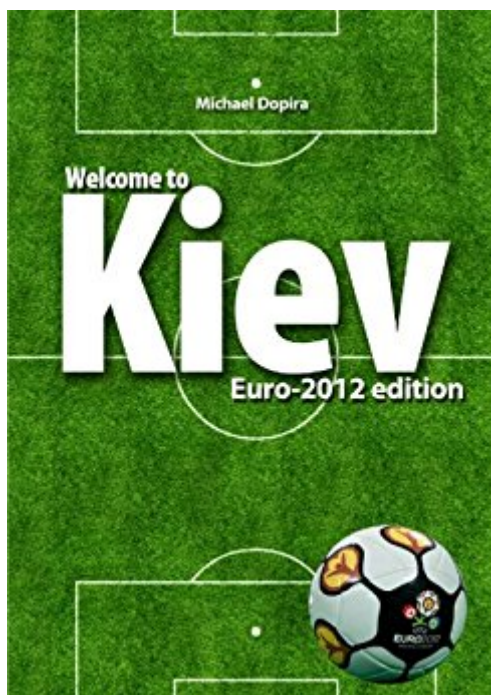

Structure of the guide helps you not get confused as your travel experience evolves. The description starts from arrival to the Boryspol (Borispol KBA) airport, and takes you to the city where questions of accommodation (including hotels, apartments, hostels etc), transportation (including public transpiration network, taxi and cars for rent), dining (including the restaurants and recommended fast-foods) and entertainment (including bars, pubs, clubs and other attractions of nightlife) are discussed in details. Optimal clothing and Kiev weather in different seasons are described in a separate chapter. Customs and traditions are not passed out as well. The guide is relatively short in order not to get you bored, but it is sufficiently detailed to make you feel comfortable in the city of Kiev.The book would save you not only time and nerves, but also a considerable sum of money! Numerous tips and insights scattered across the book would show that a trip can be much more fun for less money. Our aim is making your travel experience as smooth as possible, so apart from discussing such physical matters as transportation, accommodation, board etc, such intangible issues as Ukrainian mentality and basic rules of behaving are paid substantial attention in the guide. The guide contains extremely useful additional materials, such as a general map of Kiev and the detailed map of the city center. All objects mentioned in the text are highlighted in either of maps. There are also Kiev metro station map (paper copy of which is NOT available at metro stations by the way) and rules of reading Cyrillic texts, which form the necessary minimum of information you need not to feel lost in the city.
