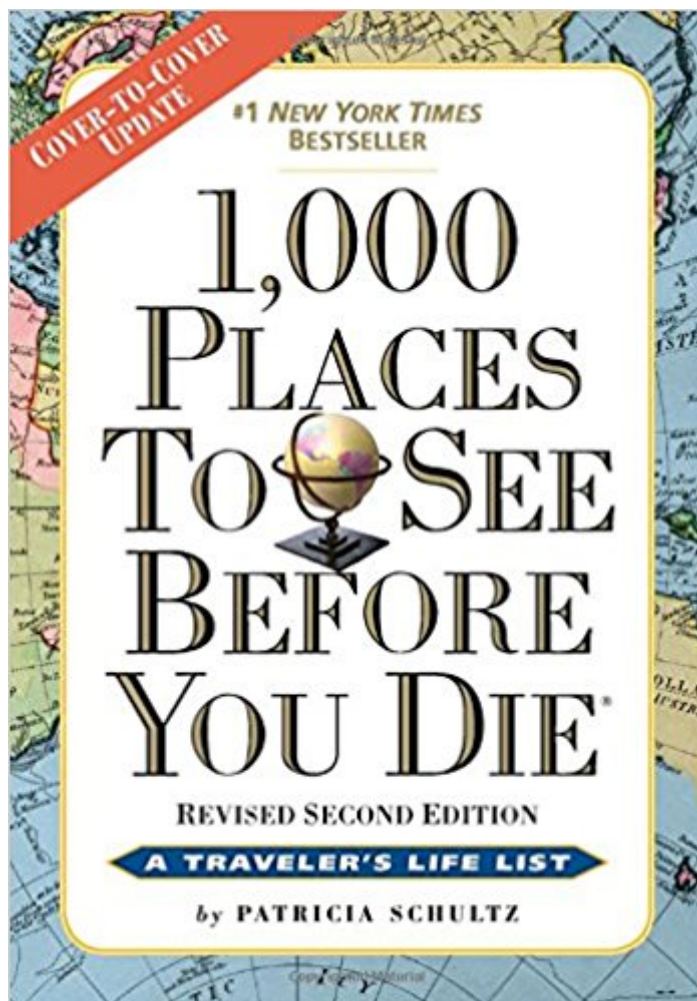

From the sites to see in the area of the country where I live, Florida and the southeastern US, this book simply hits the well known areas and doesn't venture off the well-trodden path of most tourists. I was looking for something that didn't tell me what I already knew or could find in most any travel book. Consequently, I expect the same treatment of places I'm not as familiar with. I was hoping for something more unique.

This was for a student who mentioned to me that she wanted to travel when she graduated high school. What better book and what better way to "sample" the world than 1,000 Places? I've had this book for years, I put little post-its on the pages of places I go, checking them off. I wonder if I'll hit them all??? Okay, probably not. Still it's a great goal, and I hope I passed onto her the love of travel.

This book is a treasure. My only complaint would be that it crams too much information into a small space. For this reason it has very tiny print. I do enjoy getting an overview of all the places the world has to offer. I read the part on Japan after returning from a 2 week trip. It touched on many of the places I visited. If anything, it assured me that I had seen almost all the Japanese "highlights" and more. I'm about to plan my next getaway and this book will be a great resource for all my adventures.

This comprehensive book provides affordable locations for the average traveller as well as pictures highlighting the places of interest. This was much smaller than I anticipated, not in content but in size. The print and pictures are very small, so get your glasses out, you'll need them. I do think it has an amazing amount of content and the value is certainly there in terms of content. I think it would be a lot more enjoyable if it wasn't so small and hard to read. This is the size of a small paperback, but about 1200 pages thick, so you will get your money's worth if you have good eyes or don't mind donning your reading glasses. It is also very heavy. Maybe it would be nicer if it was bigger and broken down into separate books by sections of the world so also not so heavy to hold when reading for a long time.

I bought this book for myself many years ago and I'm delighted to say I've been to see about 500 of these places in my 71 years. I recently purchased this book for my son and hope that he'll be able to see all of them by the time he reaches 71. It's a wonderful book for anybody. Travel has been the joy of my life and I would recommend this book to anyone.
