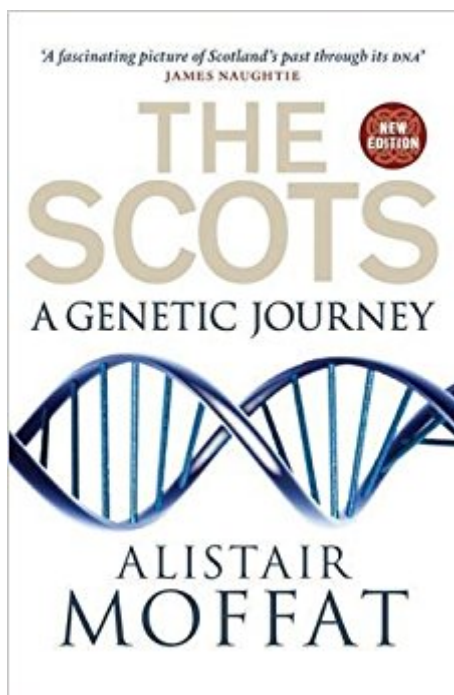

Born and raised in Kelso in the Scottish Border country, Alistair Moffat has often left the place in body, but never in spirit. He attended the universities of St Andrews, Edinburgh and London, and also received some tough education on the rugby fields of the Borders. In 1976 Alistair took over the running of the Edinburgh Festival Fringe and in five years made it the largest and most dynamic arts festival in the world. A prolific and popular author, Alistair's books *Kelsae*, *The Borders*, *The Reivers*, *The Sea Kingdoms*, *The Wall* and *Tuscany* are all published by Birlinn.

This book provide a great deal of info concerning the dna of scotch people. The writing was good, detailed and comprehensive. I was looking specifically for the Pict connection with Smith and the Pict culture. dna research is confusing to me and seems to change all the time, so I am not sure if it could be updated in the book. The dna for Picts was missing (and is questionably available), also I would have like to have more of the Pict social structure of the warriors in the feudal environment prior to 1300 ad. This could explain what happened to the Picts in Scotch history. Overall the book was well done and informative.

Front board of this hardback had been bent (bows inward) by some force that may have occurred in shipping. It came in a softside envelope. The dust cover had a knife cut (about 2 1/2 inches) on front board edge but was easily repaired. The interior is perfect, no damage of any kind. I feel I have in my possession an excellent book that addresses the research I am doing but the price of the book, considering its damage may be a bit high. Again, the bowing of the front board may have occurred in shipping.

His "The British: A Genetic Journey" was also excellent. Moffat is a good writer and is able to make the dryness of date more colorful and juicier.
