

Rider Haggard's classic adventure novel King Solomon's Mines unleashed gold fever more than a century ago, many had sought to find the source of the great king's wealth. In this new adventure-a hybrid of Indiana Jones and Herodotus (Sunday Times, London); Tahir Shah tries his hand at the quest. Intrigued by a map he finds in a shop not far from the site of the temple, Shah assembles a multitude of clues to the location of Solomon's mines. Some come from ancient texts, including the Septuagint, the earliest form of the Bible, and some from geological, geographical, and folkloric sources. All point across the Red Sea to Ethiopia, the land of the Queen of Sheba, Solomon's lover, who bore Solomon's son Menelik and founded Ethiopia's imperial line. Shah's trail takes him on a wild ride; by taxi, bus, camel, donkey, and Jeep; that is sure to delight all travelers.

Author struggled with the elements

`In Search Of King Solomon's Mines' was first published over a decade ago, but it is still a treasure whose value becomes more apparent with the passing of years.Ten years ago I was captivated by the journey through Ethiopia, by the ancient churches hewn out of solid rock in Lalibela, the hair-raising ascent to the monastery in Debra Damo, the desert trek with people from the greatly feared Danikil tribe and their sullen camels, the final leg under atrocious conditions after the dilapidated jeep that once belonged to Haile Sellasie had been abandoned and six mules had been hired.What I now realise is that `King Solomon's Mines' is about much more than a physical country. This being Africa, ordinary people are exceptionally kind and generous, and spirits are never far from their thoughts. In the eastern town of Harar, Yusuf has the responsibility of slaughtering cattle and feeding the meat to jinn in the form of hyenas, which would otherwise come to the city walls at night and take the children. In the West, the mountain peaks known as Sheba's Breasts are out of bounds to locals because of their association with the Devil.At a deeper level, this book is about the People of the Book, Jews, Christians and Muslims, about their common heritage in the Old Testament of the Bible, and about the situation in which they now find themselves. It is written in language of majestic simplicity. For me, this treasure is still not completely in focus, but I trust that time and Tahir Shah will eventually succeed in dispelling my ignorance.lta

I really enjoyed this wise and witty travelogue. I knew next to nothing about Ethiopia before reading it, it's a real eye opener. I especially enjoy how Tahir Shah seems to use this extra-sensory net when he travels, random encounters become clues. It's hard to describe but he has a knack for living and a gift for writing, I'm hooked.

Not only is this book a hilarious, exciting adventure; it's also a fantastic insight into the customs and folklore of the Ethiopian people. While Shah takes a sometimes arrogant and off-putting tone when speaking about the local people, overall this just adds to the humor and depth of the book.TL;DR: I'm not sure who wouldn't love this book. It's witty, exciting, and informative all at once. Also, the Kindle edition is only \$2.09. No excuses to not read it.
