

A remarkably complete and emotionally rich telling of what went down. There is a blush of the new and a fervent optimism in this book that is palpable. A 320 page hardback with dustcover. Well over 200 black and white photographs with a couple of video image captures. A rather basic printing job done in Hong Kong: heavy slightly reflective stock, a decent binding. With virtually all of the book done in matte or glossy white on paper that was prone to foxing, this is not a book designed to age well.
