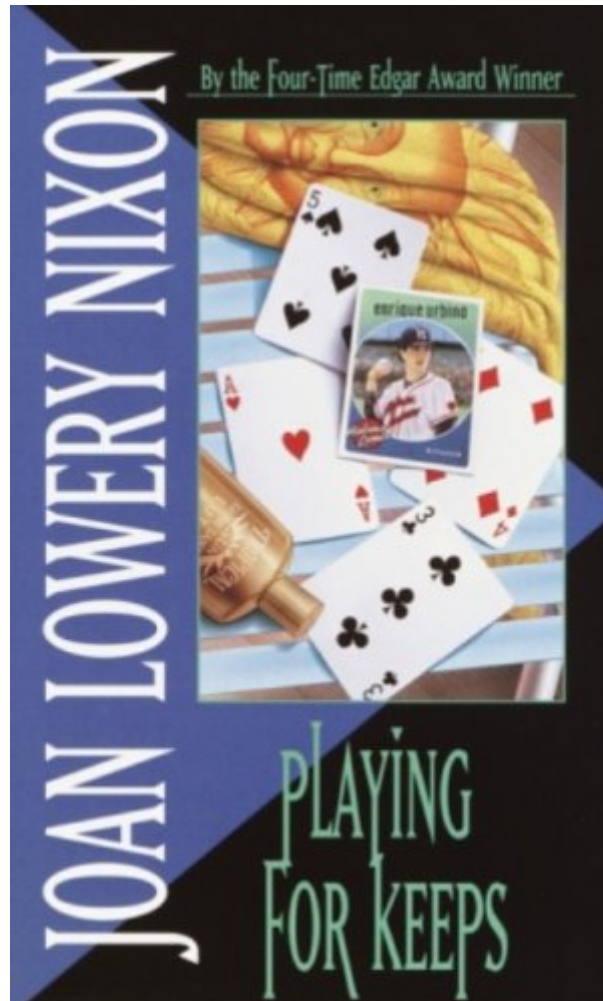




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Playing For Keeps

After two murders, in which Ricky was suspected, Rosie was determined to prove him innocent. I could probably relate closer to Rosie than any of the other characters.
