

It was a letdown over the rude conversations between adults so focused on people's appearance & the disrespectful way children addressed their "elders". I have all the "Anne" books & treasure them. This book I will Not keep ..it was a huge disappointment.

Lucy Maud Montgomery's 1929 novel, "Magic for Marigold", is something of a departure from her other works. We are introduced to Marigold Lesley shortly after her birth, as her family argues over a proper name for the new child. This plot point is settled in typically entertaining Montgomery fashion, and the book follows Marigold to the edge of adolescence. Marigold is a lovely child who grows up in the midst of a very traditional multi-generational family on Prince Edward Island, Canada. She is gifted with a vivid imagination that allows her to appreciate the natural beauty of her family home, and to populate it with imaginings, including a playmate named Sylvia, who is completely real to Marigold for much of the story. The story itself is told in episodic fashion from Marigold's point of view, as she learns from her encounters with the adult world and other children. The episodes are generally humorous but with a certain wisdom to impart. Among the highlights are Marigold's day with a "real" princess and the visit of a supposedly "perfect" cousin. At story's end, Marigold has begun to discover the ups and downs of dealing with boys, and the unfortunate but perhaps inevitable loss of childhood innocence. "Magic for Marigold" is highly recommended as an entertaining example of L.M. Montgomery's superb storytelling skills, presented from the point of view of a slightly unusual heroine.
